Saving Your iLife 06 Stuff

- @ iTunes: File > Back Up to Disc
- @ iPhoto: Copy iPhoto Library folder to disk
- iMovie: File > Burn Project to Disc or drag project folder to another disk

Saving Your iLife 06 Stuff

- @ iDVD: File > Archive Project
- GarageBand: File > Save As and click "Save As Archive" checkbox
- @ iWeb: Copy "Domain" folder to disk
 - ~/Library/Application Support/iWeb

Naming Conventions for Photos

- Thinking Points
 - How do you get your photos into your computer?
 - How do you find them?
 - How do you work with them?
 - How do you back them up?

Ideas for Naming Photos

- Make a copy as soon as you load your photos. Burning a CD of originals = negatives
- Add keywords and descriptive names as you import immediately!
- Some people like naming folders or projects with dates
- For heritage photos, dates can be very important!

More Ideas

- Adobe Bridge can read iPhoto files and catalog them
- @ Bridge can't read Aperture
- Bring old files forward as software changes

 don't let your files become unreadable
 (iPhoto does it automatically)
- Use "duplicate" in iPhoto to make copies

More Ideas

- Aperture keeps variations of original; all versions are easily available
- iPhoto does not easily allow you to find the original after you have edited the photo. So use duplicate !!!!! and work on the duplicate.
- @ Back up regularly
- iPhoto categorizes photos in year by date photo is taken — may not put imported files in right year

More Ideas

Photoshop variations: name each stage of project so that you can go back to earlier stages
